I have the honor to request that, after the expiration of my sick leave on 15th February, I may be medically examined for fitness to serve in East Africa, and that should I be found fit, I may be allowed to relinquish my appointment in the East African Political Dept. as I am still subject to malarial attacks and do not think I can stand the climatal strain.

I would also request that inquiries may be made from East Africa with a view to the payment of my war bonus. With the exception of a few months spent on my farm on what was called "indefinite leave" I served continuously throughout the war in East Africa until I was invalided in 1918.
