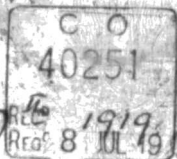

I have yr letter this morning  
which many thanks.  
I understand you have had to  
refer to the Governor of the East  
African Protectorate. When I left  
Africa, I was assured by all  
authorities that a pension was  
due to me & that I should receive

In the meantime, certainly  
circumstances are such that  
cannot meet essential current  
expenditure - from the time I  
returned home from E. Africa, I  
have worked when not in a  
condition, & not being able  
afford necessary non-surgical  
and spent my health has been

all together & at the present  
 moment am doing nothing, but  
 endeavoring to get my health back.  
 In the meantime I have nothing to do in  
 my husband's property. Cannot  
 help us & my own near re-  
 lations are dead.

I have had to  
 appeal to the "Officers Families  
 Fund" for help.

I must add that  
 I worked very hard in B. S. A. &  
 P. S. A. all through the war &  
 have had no recognition of it in  
 any way. I was at the 5-  
 year 6 year without change  
 in England, & perhaps it may  
 be understood what that means.  
 It was a great struggle to get  
 through the winter. & despite  
 the situation & general ill conditions  
 I had to work. However now I  
 am forced to rest & this is
