I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter No. 2.8.8.4./E.A. of 5th inst., and to express my appreciation of the generosity of the Secretary of State and His Excellency the Governor of the East African Protectorate in placing me upon the permanent and pensionable staff of the Protectorate.

2. May I be permitted to take this opportunity of bringing up the question of the Assistant Game Rangers of the East African Protectorate with regard to their being also placed upon the permanent and pensionable staff. I am aware that this question is one in which a decision has already been given in the negative by the Secretary of State (then Lord Crewe) in I believe 1910, but I am unable to refer to the despatch in question.

3. In view of this I broach the subject with diffidence but I feel that these officers naturally look to me to forward their interests, and I feel that it is my duty to do so. I therefore wish to ask whether the Secretary of State will allow the matter to be brought up for further consideration.

4. I am conscious that such an application should be made through His Excellency the Governor of the East African Protectorate, and I trust my present action will be overlooked under the circumstances.
