Amongst the cases in which an officer, though not invalided, is a directed to present himself to the Medical Advisers of the Colonial Office, there will be special ones in which it will be desirable that this report should be rendered, though it will of course not be necessary in the great majority of cases in which officers are directed to consult a Medical Adviser of the Colonial Office on arrival in England.

Procedure to be observed in venmently with confidential health reports. the the confidential health report must be rendered in quadruplicate; by the Medical Officer and flead of Department concerned, three copies being transmitted without delay; the Chief Secretary, and the fourth to the Principal Medical Officer.

These reports should be so rendered as to enable the Governor to transmit a copy to the Colomal Office by the same mail as that by which the officer concerned is due to leave the Coast, or if this is not possible not later than by the next steamer.
