I have the honour to report that subject to your approval I have authorized the grant of a ration allowance at the rate of Rs. 25/- per mensem, to the Transport Conductors in the Northern Frontier District.

2. The Transport Officer states that the cost of purchasing stores locally is very heavy and that unless some inducement is offered in the matter of wages and allowances it will be difficult to retain the services of the conductors or to replace them.
