Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of the 20th instant on the subject of the employment of Asiatic labourers for work on the Deep Water Pier at Kilindini.

2. The probable term of employment could, I think, be more definitely stated by the contractors than by myself. The usual term is for three years and it is improbable that the Government of India would be prepared to sanction a longer period.

3. The other conditions should be similar to those which apply to men recruited for the Uganda Railway, i.e.:-

- (a) Usual wages for artisans, Rs.45 per mensem.
- (b) Half pay during the voyage or during periods of enforced idleness.
- (c) Free passages to and from India.
- (d) Allowance of a prescribed article.
