If the proposal is to be approved at all it is well worth while to anticipate it by three weeks or less in order to keep the Girama quiet.

As regards 48377/14 - it contained two proposals for expenditure over & above the £90,000 allotted for this work from the £250,000 loan. The distribution of that 0,000 is shown on p. 113 of the draft 1915-16 Estimates.
