

Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your despatch No. 279 of the 8<sup>th</sup> of April, in the subject of the list of favourable opportunities in the African Banking staff. I enclose a printed list from which you will observe that your recommendation as regards the substitution of the cash post of Deputy Chief Accountant for one of the posts of Ass't. Chief Accountant has been adopted.

2. The only other alteration which has been made in the list is that the note referring to the German staff has been omitted. The note as it stood was as follows:

case misleading, since the additional pensionable staff would come to exist when Mr. Howell is the ordinary course of serving both.

One of the four senior staff of Post Engineers, and, apart from this, it appears to me to be necessary to fix further corner to the matter in the light of Mr. Hamp's position.

3. Except at the date of first staff with the Dept., Mr. Hamp's position only differs from Mr. Howell's in that he has been engaged on agreement for service in the Railway Dept., an arrangement which was considered unnecessary. In the case of Mr. Howell, he has it; it is hardly plausible to require five years' service on agreement in Mr. Hamp's case and both officers, if their work is unsatisfactory, should therefore be confined in their ability as from three years from

the date of their first arrival in the Protectorate.

4. Including the Bentley, Dr. Grant Davis, and Mr. Atherton, there will therefore be five pensionable Assistant Engineers, and it is a question whether they should be regarded as filling the four places regular pensioned staff which have been established or one additional post which is to disappear on the occurrence of a vacancy existing two of the above instead of one, should be regarded as pensionable pensionable, but the former, the last named will be eligible for pensionable staff as soon as he completes five years service on agreement with the Dept. to the former case he will not be confined thereto unless two vacancies among the five pensionable officers occurred in the meantime.

5. I shall be glad to receive your views on the matter. From the point of view of the feasibility of amalgamating

the number of pensionable

grade, I should prefer  
the former alternative.
