The Gov. presumably means that no officer outside the Rly Dept. is suitable.

The salary is £ 450-20-500 + £ 45 a m.

It would have been preferable to fill the app. by the promotion of a Storekeeper in the Provisions in the P.A.P. or in the C.P. sense. e.g. the Storekeeper in the P.A.P. Mr. C.W. Gregory, who is on the scale £ 300-15-400 + £ 30.
