2. Captain Barrett reports that Ali Abdi's detention in Nairebi for a year has had a salutary effect both upon himself and upon his tribe and recommends his return. He is the head chief of his people and it will be much easier to administer them through him than through a number of Sub-Clief as we are now doing.

3. On Captain Barrett's suggestion Ali Abdi
was taken down to Kombase and swore an oath of
loya'typosfore the Sheikh-ul-Islam, the leading
Mahomedan religious authority in the Protectorate
