"Your telegram of April 24th respecting Somali "Secuts - Governor Ceylon asks whether they "can be confined in Jail as being cheaper "than interment in camp. I am advised that "I have no legal authority to give any "direction regarding their detention or "destination. Will you please instruct".

On 9th inst, I received your telegram of 8th in answer to the above, as follows:-

"You have been correctly advised that you have no le al authority to give instructions as to detention of Somali Scouts in "Geylon. As in communication with Governor "of Ceylon".

13. On the same day the terms of your message were communicated to the Governor of Ceylon.
