

In pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor under the provisions of the Passport Fees Ordinance, 1904, notice is hereby given that the fees payable in respect of any passport issued in the Province will after the date hereof shall be half as much as previous notices issued under the said ordinance are hereby revoked.
