THE JUSTICE AND PENALTY SYSTEMS ACT, 1915

STATEMENT OF WORKS AND PROVISIONS.

....

This Ordinance has been enacted in pursuance of instructions issued by the Secretary of State contained in Colonial Office No. 127 of the 10th February last.

1. Its object is to amend the definition of a court of trials in the Criminal and Colonial Justice Ordinance, 1914, section 7 in order that provisions issued in England other than those issued by the Sheriff Court of the County of Middlesbrough may be recognized as the "prosecutors".
