I agree that it would be fairest to regard Mr. Ford as having been invalidated from Active Service. It is clear that his illness had no connection with the termination of his engagement in the R.F. Dep't.; but it was entirely due to his ill health that he was discharged from the R.F. Volunteers, and I do not see why he was not treated as an invalid from Active Service at the time of that discharge, instead of being sent back to the R.F. Dep't.



Sir,

In reply to Mr. Harcourt's despatch No. 516 of May 6th asking for further information regarding the case of Mr. W.A. Ford, late Guard on the Uganda Railway, I have the honour to lay before you the following details:-

(a) He was taken ill at Tsavo with dysentery and fever while employed with the Uganda Railway Volunteers: and was on the sick list at Nairobi from 18th to 27th October.

(b) On the latter date he was sent to Makindu, but on arrival at that place was again taken ill and had to be brought back to Nairobi.

(c) At this time an urgent need for reduction in the Railway Staff had arisen and Mr. Ford, together with others, was given one month's notice on 28th October and paid one month's salary in advance. His discharge was not in any

any way due to his illness but to the need for retrenchment.

(d) There can, however, be no doubt that he contracted his illness while on active service with the Uganda Railway Volunteers.
