With reference to Mr. Harcourt's despatch No. 25 of 13th January last, I have the honour to inform you that the consignment of galvanized corrugated sheets referred to by Messrs. Greenway was cleared by the agents of the consignees on 5th December 1914 the charges being as follows:-

2. You will observe that Messrs. Greenway Brothers' statement is incorrect, as the rent charges exclusive of duty amounted only to £180 and not £250 to £300.
