In reply to our
telegram on 37604 we are now furnished
with sufficiently definite figures
for the Prot.^os military expenditure
up to date. We learn that, up to
31 Aug., the following sums had been
spent: -

(1) On the Protectorate's own special
military expenditure £100,000, to
which must be added £7000 for
outstanding liabilities for undrawn
pay; total £107,000.

(2) On "Common Charges", £1,190,000 less
£150,000; i.e. £1,040,000, to which must

be added £93,000 for outstanding liabilities, which gives a total of £1,133,000.

(3) On War Office charges £2,400.

On the strength of these figures I think we can apply again to the Treasury for an advance from W.O. funds to cover expenditure under (2) & (3). As regards (1), however, there will be an abatement of £125,000 to be made from the sum which we can claim ~~from~~ ^{from} the W.O.; this represents the difference between the amount of Treasury advances on account of the Prot.^{ts} own special military expenditures, and the expenditure actually incurred. The net amount, therefore, which the W.O. should give us is £1,010,400.

This sum will cover the E.A.P. overdraft on the C.A., and will leave a certain amount in hand. The C.A. are rather worried about the overdraft, because they have to release the funds we belonging to other Col^s on which they have drawn to accommodate E.A.P. They are writing to put the whole position clearly. In the meantime, pending payments from the W.O., they may have to borrow.

I think this telegram makes it abundantly clear that the suggestion in our letter to T.M. on 25057, that the overdraft was due to expenditure on Common Charges, was correct. The ^{Procs.} ~~Procs.~~ ^{own} military expenditure (£100,000) is well within the estimate of £15,000 a month.

The last half of the telegram explains that the £150,000 mentioned in the correspondence referred to is a charge under Common Charges and was not a charge.

Copy to T.M. with reference to our letter of 20 Aug. on 57604, embodying A & B, and asking for the sum in question (£1,010,400) to be either advanced from the Vote of Credit or recovered from W.O. funds in accordance with the arrangement come to in 24746; and add that the necessity of cancelling the overdraft on the C.A. has now reached a stage of extreme urgency.

Your telegram 19th August, Military Expenditure, accurate figures not available but it is certain that the amounts spent by East Africa Protectorate to 31st August are not less than as follows: **First:** Protectorate special Military expenditure £100,000. **Second:** common charges £1,190,000 less £150,000 recovered from War Office. **Third:** War Office charges £2,400. [In addition to these figures there are outstanding liabilities for undrawn pay as follows:- Under first head £7,000, under second head £93,000. It is estimated that future monthly requirements are as follows:- Under first head £2,000; under second head £100,000 under third head £480. There is apparently some misunderstanding as to sum of £150,000, see your telegram 7th March and your telegram 19th August. This sum was not advanced to Indian Expeditionary Force on account of pay out represented part of the general expenditure on transport rations etc. which has been incurred by East Africa Protectorate prior to 31st March on account of the Indian Expeditionary Force and has been included under head of Common Charges. The only charges definitely assignable to War Office appear to be those connected with the additions made to the establishment sanctioned for King's African Rifles. East Africa Protectorate also has received from Treasury £232,000, which will be set off later on against Protectorate special Military expenditure and Protectorate share of common charges.]
