The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 7.46 p.m. 18 September, 1915)

Re Sir [unclear] September 1915.

Your telegram 8th September regarding

arrangements in Protectorate Hospitals. Prior to advent of expeditionary force nursing establishment was fourteen nurses and one matron. In August 1915 General Officer Commanding sanctioned war establishment of thirty-five nurses capable of dealing with 2,000 casualties. Greatest number of European casualties at any one time has not yet exceeded 400 but extra establishment has been allowed in anticipation of any heavy fighting. Of these thirty-five twenty-two have been obtained locally one-third being pupil nurses as trained nurses were not available in the Protectorate. Twelve are now on the way from South Africa and one is required to complete establishment. Many applications received and are being received from South Africa but none in addition to those already serving from qualified applicants in British East Africa. There are also in addition [unclear] nurses who are either serving from [unclear] and are being defrayed [unclear]. General Officer Commanding repudiated charge of [unclear] and carelessness. He and I have visited hospitals personally and approved nothing defective.




