With reference to Mr. Bowring's despatch No. 427 of 18th July 1912, I have the honour to report that the retirement from the Government service of Sheikh Abdul Wahid bin Athman, Inspector of Government property at Mombasa, has become necessary on account of ill health and old age (he is approximately 70 years old).
