Gov. Ryall'd considers that same concessions should
be made as to pension etc. to the Volunteer Force as
are made to Colonial Volunteers serving elsewhere
with Colonial Forces or with British Army.

Gov. P.A.P. 40925/14 considers that the same
terms should be conceded as in the case of
men of similar standing in the Home Forces.

W.O. practice is to treat all men in the
Land Forces of the Crown who are paid from
Army (Imperial) Funds in the same way as
Regulars, under the terms of the Royal Warrant
for the pay etc of the Army. (Not applicable to other
organisations at present under the Army except
some exception) - see copy enclosed

I presume that there are copies of the Warrant
in all the P.A.P.'s. If not we must obtain
one and agree. It is important to keep up

When I take it, I think, that the Govt of Nyasaland and P.A.P. would agree to these terms; but we have not yet consulted Uganda, Rwanda or Z'bar, where the question may arise ultimately.

On 2nd Oct to Gov/4472/E.A.P. The Govt P.A.P. suggest that dependents of non-European volunteers should be treated under K.A.R. Regs 188 & 292 (see 23rd page annexed). This seems a fair arrangement, and might be recommended to the other E.A.P. Profs.

I think that we must first obtain agreement on the question between the different Prof's, and we shall then have to consult Treasury with regard to Uganda, Nyasaland and Z'bar.

Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 15th instant, No. 39277, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, that all Officers of the Land Forces of the Crown, paid from Army (Imperial) Funds, dying or becoming disabled as the result of War Service, are treated for purposes of widow's pension, compassionate allowance, retired pay, half pay, and wounds pension, under the terms of the Royal Warrant for the Pay etc. of the Army, in the same way as if they had held the same rank in the Regular Army. Members of such Forces below the rank of Officer would be similarly treated as regards widow's and children's pension, disability pension etc.

The cases of persons not regularly commissioned or enlisted would be specially considered for the grant of an allowance appropriate to the position they held when killed or disabled.
