

I am commanded by the Army Council to enquire whether the Secretary of State for the Colonies would see any objection to the War Office communicating directly with the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the British East African Protectorate, and with His Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Zanzibar, on the subject of the military operations that are in progress in East Africa.

Mr. Harcourt will be aware that it has been arranged that these operations shall henceforward be carried out under the orders of the War Office.
