Sir.

With reference to my despatch No.1029 of December 14th 1914, respecting the estimated excess on the cost of the Mombasa Wireless Station, I have the honour to report further as follows:-

- 2. In that despatch I stated that a sum of £5,800 had been allotted for the buildings and plant, and anticipated that there would be an excess of expenditure over this amount of at least £1,500.
- 3. By 31st Earch last the forer provision was exceeded by £752 only, and the excess was met from departmental savings in the Post Office and Public Works Departments.
  - 4. The work was, however, at that date, far from completed, and considerable further expenditure was foreseen. Though the plant and buildings have now been finished, and the former is in working order.

- 5. The total expenditure, as anticipated, for the current year will amount to roughly £2,728 of which £1,328 is in respect of plant, and £1,400 in respect of buildings.
- 6. For this amount there is no provision in the Estimates. In ordinary circumstances it would be met by curtailing expenditure on other works, but as the total provision this year is so small there appears to be no other course than to meet the expenditure from balances.
- 7. I have, consequently, sanctioned the issue of Special Warrants for the sums in question and provision will be made accordingly in the Supplementary Estimates.
- 8. I trust my action in this respect will meet with your approval.
