With further reference to your Note No. 1387 of April 28th and to my Note of the 6th instant, regarding Commandant Moulana's mission, I have the honour to inform you that the enquiries made by the Governor of British East Africa as to the possibility of providing mule transport for the battery of guns under the charge of this officer have not had a satisfactory result.

It appears that no mules or donkeys are procurable in the Protectorate and that the Government of India could not provide mules before November, and then only at considerable cost.
