The Director of Military Operations presents his compliments to the Under Secretary of State for the Colonies and begs to draw his attention to the fact that in the Official Gazette of the East African Protectorate, publication of November 18th 1914 certain movements of H.M.'s ships are reported as entering and leaving Kilindini Harbour.

The attention of the Director of Military Operations has further been drawn by a private East African person to the fact that in the East African Leader Newspaper of November 14 and 21st respectively, official communiques were issued giving details of the attack which took place on Lamu, mentioning the composition of the force engaged.

TELEGRAM. The Secretary of State for the Colonies to the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate.

(Sent 11.30 a.m. 26th December 1914.)

December 23rd.

War Office point out that in Official Gazette East Africa Protectorate of November 18th certain movements of His Majesty's ships were reported and that in East African Leader of November 14th and 21st official communiqués giving details of Longido engagement and mentioning composition of forces engaged were issued.

Please see that this does not occur again. No details as to movements and composition of forces should be made public as any such information may be of value to the enemy forces in German East Africa.
