I have the honour to refer to Colonial Regulation No.29 to the effect that salaried public officers not be connected with any company or undertaking which might bring their private interests into real or apparen conflict with their public duties, and to submit for you favourable consideration the case of Mr. R. A. Duncan Clerk, ClassI, in the Chief Mechanical Engineer's Depar

ment of this Administration Mr. R. B. Duncan, the ther of Mr. R. A. Duncan who is the eldest son, owned a grocery and generalize

provision business in Mairobi cafled H. B. Duncan lite and died in January 1950. Since his death the business has been administered by the Public Trustee.

Under the will of Mr. R. B. Duncan, practically the whole of the shares of the business are owned by his widow, who is an invalid living in Edinburgh and never likely to return to denya. On the widow (Mrs. Duncan) 's death, the shares of the property will be divided amongst the surviving children, and Mr. H. A. Duncan, being the eldest son, has been invited to join the board of Directors since his brothers are not of age. Duncan is naturally anxious to become fully acquainted with all matters concerning the business both in his own interests and on behalf of his brothers and sisters and, should he join the Board, he would be in no way connected

with the running of the business which is a onducted by a paid manager acting under the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors holds about six meetings a year and, in the event of Mr. Duncan being allowed to join, the Board would in future hold these meetings after 4 p.m. i.e. after office hours.

- 4. There is no question of Mr. Dungan investing capital in the business and he has been offered by the pirectors one ordinary Shs. 20/ share, which is the necessary share qualification.
- 5. The General Manager has parefully considered the question and recommends that are Duncan should be allowed to join the Board of Directors as he does not consider that he will be prevented thereby in any way from devoting his full activities to the service of the Administration nor does he consider that Mr. Duncan's duties on the Board will conflict with his duties as a hallway servant. The Public Trustee has also recommended that Mr. Duncan should be allowed to join the Board, and he has further assured me that if at any time Mr. Duncan should be devoting more time to the Board than is necessary, or becoming involved in any way with business so that it would conflict with his duties as a servant of this Administration, he would vote him off the Board.
- 6. In the circumstances explained above, it appears to me that Mr. R. A. Duncan's case merits special consideration, and that if he were allowed to join the Board of Directors of R. B. Duncan Ltd. it would not bring his private interests into conflict with his public duties.

I accordingly recommend for your approval that he should be allowed to join the Board under the conditions mentioned above.
