


All the five specimens contained some small dark specimens of extraneous matter. They compared very well in strength with strong kraft papers of a heavier finish, and were considerably paler in colour than is usual for the latter.

Notes on the Results of Tests carried out at Milan.

These reports are very interesting, especially as regards the effect of the comparatively short time of besting

(referred to in the reports as "refining") on the strength and character of the waterleaf (or unsized) papers produced. Excluding the results obtained for Series 1 papers, which were apparently thin and difficult to prepare, the beating times varied from 20 minutes to 100 minutes. The results show that all the specimens tested were of try good tensile strength, and gave rather higher elengation values than are usually given

or foldered by the training papers from 200 to 1.000 folds and over. The specimen (Series 6) which withstood 34.250 double folds before breaking was therefore of quite exceptional strength.

Theresults obtained in Milan (and also by Callender's Cable and Construction Company) confirm the
