

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Flood's letter of the 8th December, 1933 (3194/33.) and earlier correspondence regarding a despatch from the Governor of Kenya requesting standing authority for the payment, without prior reference to the Secretary of State, of compensation not exceeding £20 to natives who incur the loss of personal possessions while employed by Government.

In reply I am to request you to inform Secretary Sir Philip Gunliffe-Lister that, in the circumstances represented, My Lords concur in his proposal to give the authority for which the Governor asks and so that, in such matters, a uniform practice may be followed in all the East African Dependencies. They agree to similar standing authority being given to the Governors of Nyasaland and the Tanganyika Territory.



Sir,

With reference to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire's despatch No. 1176 of the 20th August, 1923, I have the honour to command, for your favourable consideration, a claim for compensation, which has been received on behalf of three natives employed by the Game Department, in respect of loss of their personal effects in circumstances beyond their control.

2. In November, 1932, the natives in question, two Game Scouts and a Tracker, were ordered to proceed by dhow from Lamu to Mombasa on duty. The dhow sank off Kipini and these natives lost personal possessions valued at Shs. 60/-.

3. I trust you will agree that this is not a case in which the persons suffering loss should have been expected to insure, and will sanction the payment of Shs. 60/- compensation.

4. I take this opportunity of referring to the previous ruling on this subject and of enquiring whether you would be willing to consider extending my powers in order to enable me in such cases, where no new principle is involved and the claims are small, to authorise payment of compensation not exceeding
