I agree with action proposed above. It would not  
be sound to amalgamate parts 1 & 3. The  
telemetry work in Kanga would suffer thereby  
and it would not be possible for one man  
to carry out the duties of these two parts  
with efficiency. The suppression of part 2

should be possible for a time at any rate. The  
only difficulty likely to be experienced would arise  
from a serious & widespread outbreak of disease  
reverted to such a case it should be possible  
to bring in a Vet. officer from the field to assist  
at Headquarters.

I am directed by Secretary Sir Philip Curcliffe-Hisler to inform you that he has approved a recommendation made by the Acting Governor of Kenya that as part of the reorganisation of the Department of Agriculture which is now taking place, the post of Assistant Chief Veterinary Officer which you had should be abolished.

2. Mr. Moore has recommended at the same time that you should be employed as a Veterinary Officer for a further four years service on a salary of £1,000 per annum personal to yourself, subject to your being passed medically fit for active work in an out-district.

3. If you desire to accept the proposed arrangement, you should notify this Department and should present yourself for examination to the Consulting Physician at as early a date as possible. A letter of authority for the purpose is enclosed.
