If Harragin sails 5th Oct. Kenya will have to bear cost of two Attorneys Genl. for 3 months. If Bruce is returning considers he shd. return at once and act till Jan. or Feb. when Mr. Gregor will come off Kenya funds and Harragin can be apptd. If this course not possible Harragin shd. sail earliest possible. Special Order. wd. have to be passed to regularise pension position.

The objections against the first alternatives are

(a) Mr. Bruce's leave doesn't end till Dec 20.
It will be seen from Mr. Flood's minute of 23/8 that in Mr. McGregor's view Mr. Bruce has
shinned, after the long spell Mr. Bruce has
just done, it would be left with the Govt.
to send him back to Kenya early.

Probably Kenya major factor acting
arrangements were with Mr. Bruce
but this wd. be difficult.

(b) Mr. Harragin's Nyasaland leave, which
had returned to Nyasaland (had he not
acquitted a ~~trial~~ on Oct 13). If the Govt.
accepted a trial on Oct 13. If the Govt.
alternative were accepted, presumably he
would return to Nyasaland for 2 or 3
months before proceeding to Kenya. Would
not Nyasaland have just cause for complaint
at having to bear the cost of his passage there
for so short a period of service?

(c) In his offer of app't to Kenya the

Govt. was told in so many words that
he wd. be transferred on Oct 5th.

It was fully realised at the time the
Telegram No. 60. on 25/8 was sent that
there would be an order.

I think: the Govt's 2nd alternative
must be adopted.

If so? the Govt of K. shd. be informed
by Tel., & the Govt already forward an
order. Harragin's file may issue except the
defects to Kenya wh. will need some
modification. *Traversies*: 18/9

Mr. Bruce has put in 33 months in Kenya, and is at present on leave until September. He declined the appointment offered to him in the Gambia and the Acting Governor now suggests that he should be called upon to return forthwith and act until Mr. McGregor comes off Kenya funds, when Mr. Harragin can come up from Nyasaland and take over the job of Attorney-General. I spoke to Sir Joseph Byrne about it and he is inclined to agree with me that the best thing to do would be to let Mr. Harragin go to Kenya as suggested and face the trouble of having double pay for the period of the overlap. He has not any particular confidence in Mr. Bruce's ability to act as Attorney-General for the period involved. I think then that the only solution is to accept the situation that

Mr. Harragin sail on the 5th of October as arranged, which would get him out in time to succeed Mr. McGregor on or soon after the 1st of November. It will not be possible or fair to get him out any earlier. If you agree we should inform Kenya accordingly by telegram and let the arrangements proceed.



Your telegram No. - Confidential I think
that it would be better for Branigan to begin his legal
career in a Dependency where he has not served as a
junior Administrative officer. I should be glad therefore
if you would offer him transfer to Colonial Legal Service
in the Tanganyika vacancy which is urgent. Salary £720
to £920 less levy. There is no objection to your informing
him if you desire of alternative possibility of his being
appointed Crown Counsel Kenya which I should be willing
to approve if he prefers it. I do not anticipate that
standard minimum salary for Colonial Legal Service posts
in Africa will be less than £720. If transfer accepted
please arrange details with Governor Tanganyika and
inform me.

No. 3 Branigan. I have no objection to person named being appointed to Tanganyika but in local interest recommend that he should be retained here and promoted to existing Crown Counselancy. Mac Gregor considered quality of his work amply merits commencing salary of £500, but as initial salary of Crown Counsel not yet fixed presume that warning should be given that promotion will entail acceptance of new salary scale when approved although pension constant will remain unchanged. In any case do not consider that person named should be penalised as to salary if retained here instead of appointed to Tanganyika.

Your telegram No. 196. If Harragin sails on 5th October Kenya will have to bear cost of two Attorneys General for at least three months. If Bruce is returning to Kenya consider he should be called on return at once and act till January or February next when McGregor will have come off Kenya funds and Harragin can be appointed from such date if this is not feasible. Harragin should sail earliest possible in which case he would act as Attorney General till McGregor is off Kenya funds and special ordinance would be necessary to regularise his pension position. McGregor would then sail 1st November.
