Miss Kenny. We shall have to watch Miss Kenny's case-because, if she is not invalided, she will have to be compulsorily retired on the conclusion of her forthcoming leave. A note should be made on her file so that the point is not overlooked.

Miss Wilson will only have completed fourteen years' service when she is retired, and only have just reached 50. Her reports

2. These officers were notified of the decision of Executive Council and were given an opportunity of submitting any representations that they wished to make against the decision.

3. It will be observed from the attached summary circulated to Executive Council that Mr.Gilbert has no representations to make and that of the other officers concerned only Mr.Glarke and Mrs.Angus have submitted representations.

These were considered by Executive Council who advised that in the case of Mr. Clarke the original decision should stand, and in the case of Mrs. Angus

that she should be retired at the end of the third term of 1937 (about the middle of December, 1937).

In regard to the representations made by Miss R.K. Sharp, Nursing Sister, I would explain that Council originally recommended that this officer who attained the age of 50 years on the 19th June, 1934, and who will complete 20 years' service on the 15th February, 1935, should be retired at the end of her present tour of service which she will complete on the 13th April, 1936. In view of the representations made by her, Council have now advised that Miss Sharp's case should be reconsidered next year and her name has accordingly been amitted from the list of officers recommended for retirement.

4. I therefore submit the names of the officers recommended for retirement for your approval. I may add that in considering the retirement of these officers due regard was given to paragraph 5 of Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister's despatch Confidential (2) of the 27th March, 1933.

- 2. With the exception of Mr. C.T. COGIE who applied to retire voluntarily and whose retirement has been approved, the above officers were notified of Council's decision and were asked to submit before the 15th October, 1935, except in the case of Mrs. M.L. ANGUS who was asked to submit before the 21st regard to the decision.
  - The following replies have been received:
  - Mr. F.H. CLARKE states that he has no representations to make and feels that by the end of his present tour of service his usefulness as a Game Warden, in the field, will certainly have come to an end and asks that should it possibly happen that Government would wish him to do another tour of service in his present capacity at headquarters, it would afford him great pleasure to do
- Miss R.K. SHARP requests that she be allowed to extend her tour by six months to October 1938. The Director of ledical Services states that he is doubtful whether Miss Sharp's health will enable her to do more than a 30 months' tour (October 1937) and in these circumstances is unable to recommend that her request be granted.
- Mrs. M.L.ANGUS requests that she be allowed to extend her 3. present tour which she will complete in November 1936 to four years and to retire at the end of the third term of 1937. She makes this request primarily for reasons connected with her own family, but is also informed by the Principal of the School in which she is employed that this date would be much more convenient from the point of view of the School. The Director of Education states that he has no objection to Management of the School. has no objection to Mrs. Angus extending her tour to 1937 provided no additional leave is granted to her in respect of the last year of service. Mrs. Angus has expressed her willingness to accept this proposed condition.
