I am in receipt of your letter No. M. 7663, of the 9th instant, enclosing the attached correspondence in connection with the application made for permission on behalf of Fazal or Faisal Mohammed to visit this country.

Jan Mohammed, brother of the man named in the application, has been interviewed, at his residence, 8, City Road, Bristol, and it has been ascertained that he arrived in England on the 10th May, 1930, and came to Bristol about 5½ years ago. As far as is known to my officers he is a man of good character and reputation. He is by occupation a travelling silk merchant, and has held pedlar's certificates since 26th May, 1930; the first having been issued at Perth, and the current certificate was issued in Bristol on the 19th June last. He obtains his goods from Rama, 5, Grove Street, London, E.1., and has many customers in this City and the surrounding districts.

It has also been ascertained from Jan Mohammed that he contemplates paying a temporary visit to India, and desires that during his absence his brother Fazal shall carry on his business, consequently his brother has abandoned the proposal to join his cousin Nakodari at Newcastle.

Jan Mohammed informed my officer that his brother is in possession of a British Indian passport which was issued at Lahore, and that he was born about 1917, in Lot, No 477 District, Pyl Pur, India.
