Sir,

with reference to Sir Joseph Byrne's Confidential despatch No. 47 of the 6th May, 1936, regarding the demarcation of Native Reserve boundaries, I have the honour to inform you that since the date of that despatch no work in connection with gazetted boundaries has been performed by the Survey Department, surveys having been confined in the main to demarcation of certain areas in accordance with the recommendations of the Kenya Land Commission.

The details of the work undertaken are as follows:-

2. Surveys were also carried out in respect of the Kendur Salt Lick (0.6 mile), which was purchased by the Algeyo Local Native Council from Captain Rawson Shaw, and in

in respect of the area (1.1 miles) added to the Kiambu Native Reserve in exchange for the area excluded from the Reserve for the purpose of the Nairobi Waterworks.

3. Administrative officers have continued to ensure that boundaries already demarcated are maintained, renewing the boundary marks where necessary.
