With reference to your letter No. M.06385/37 dated the 15th Jamuary addressed to the Under Secretary of State, regarding the two whelers to be supplied for the use of the Kenya Royal Mayal Volunteer Reserve, I have the honour to inform you that the next Union Castle vessel sailing to East Africa after the s.s. "Liandovery Castle" is the s.s. "Liandaff Castle" leaving London on the 17th February. This vessel, however, is unable to accept either of the whalers owing to the amount of cargo already booked.

In order to avoid delay in the shipment of the whaler which is to be forwarded in its present state, we approached the British India Steam Navigation Company who readily agreed to ship this whaler to Mombase freight free by the s.s. "Nalda" which leaves London on the 5th February. With reference to your letter No. 38009/1/37 of lat December, 1937, I am commanded by My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that instructions have been given for the two whalers to be supplied for the use of the Kenya Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

It has not been found possible to arrange transport for these boats from Devonport in time for shipment in s.s. LLANDOVERY CASTLE sailing 19th January but it is hoped that the boat to be supplied in its present state will reach Chatham on or about the 25rd January.

3 A further communication regarding the date on which the other boat, which is to be repaired and fitted with masts, sails and a mounting for a Lewis Gun, will reach Chatham will be made later.

Arrangements for the transport of these boats from Chatham to South West India Dook will be made when details of the arrangements made with the Union Castle Line are communicated to this Department by the Crown Agents for the Colonies.
