I have the honour to address you on the filling of the vacancy which will occur for a Principal of the Prince of Wales School at Kabete on the expiry of Captain B.W.L.Nicholson's leave on the 29th March. Since Captain Nicholson's departure on leave in September last Mr.B.A.Astiey, B.Sc., has acted in the post with acceptance and you will be aware from his 1935 Confidential report that he had been earmarked by the late Director of Education, Mr.H.S.Scott, M.A., to succeed Captain Nicholson as Principal of the European Boys Secondary School.
