This is a complaint by Messrs. R. Chapman & Son which has been referred to us by the Board of Trade.

Early in February last the Port Captain at Mombasa ordered the fumigation of the bug-infested crew's quarters in one of Messrs. Chapman's ships, the s.s. "Clearton". The fumigation had to be done with cyanide which was obtained from Nairobi and, together with the cost of replacing some infested mattresses, cost the Company altogether 1:146.

The Company considers this excessive and points out that in Glasgow it would have cost only one-tenth of that amount. They wish to know (a) whether it was necessary in the circumstances to have cyanide brought from Nairobi at a high cost, and (b) under what authority the Port Captain was acting when he ordered the fumigation. former question obviously requires reference to Kenya, and the latter can also conveniently be referred thither, although it would seem that the powers required for such action are given under Section 73(d) of Cap 124 grave Renzew Edition. Whilst the Steamship "CIEARTAM" under our management was at Combasa at the beginning of this month loading cargo, three members of the vessel's crew (all of foreign nationality) apparently complained to the Port Captain of the presence of bugs in the crew's quarters. We have before us a copy of the Port Captain's letter to you of the 5th inst. and (a copy of the enclosures therein referred to. (h)-(x)

Me enclose a copy of an Account which we have received from the Leents who attended to the ship's affairs at Mombasa and which you will see amounts to £146-12-6. This to our mind is out of all reason and we cannot understand why it was necessary to incur the expense of obtaining cyanide from Nairobi, a considerable distance from Mombasa, when the Port Captain knew that the vessel was coming to Great Britain to discharge her cargo. As a matter of fact the ship is now on her way to Glasgow. If it were necessary to have the vessel fumigated with cyanide this could have been done at Glasgow at probably a tenth of the cost which has been incurred at Lombasa, whilst the very serious delay in sailing from Lombasa, viz.

You will of course appreciate that we are not complaining of fumigation when such a course is necessary and we stand second to none as Shipowners in our desire to see that the crew's quarters are kept in-proper condition. You will however

we are sure, appreciate that even in the best managed and regulated ships crew's quarters are from time to time subject to bugs especially in hot climates. That we are complaining of in this particular matter is the high cost of fumigation and as to wether in the circumstances it was necessary to have cyanide brought from Tairobi at a high cost.

is the Fort Captain has reported fully to you on the matter we assume that you exercise some jurisdiction over this a tarities and we shall be glad if you will let us know under what power or authority the Port Captain of Mombasa purported to act when he ordered the vessel to be funigated with cyanide at considerable cost to ourselves.

who complained that their quarters were bug intested. In consequence I visited these with the lort health difficer and inspected the quarters, the laster of the ship accompanied us.

In solte of the crews courters having een twice forigated bith sulphor juring her stay in this fort, and also scrub ed with soap and furaffin by order of the Master; large number of live boos were still greent.

Action on the advice of the fort health Officer, I made the necessary arrange ents for funication with Cyanid, and instructed the master that the ship would be detained in this Fort until this was done to the satisfaction of the fort health diffeer.

During the process of fumitation the craw were acc mmodated ashors at the seamen's Institute.

Copies of entries are subjoined which I have (b) communications affecting the case are attached terewith.

As a result of a deputation from the crew of this ship, who complained of Vermin, bugs, in their living accommodation I have in the company of the Port Medical Officer examined the accommodation and find very definite intestation.
