We have had a despatch from the Governor of Kenya referring to reports in the Press that one of the new 8,000-ton eruisers is to be named after the Colony. The Covernor goes on to say that in that event the Government of Kenya would wish to arrange to be represented at the launching ceremony and to associate itself with the ship by making suitable presentations on behalf of the Colony to the ward room and the ship's company.

I should be grateful if you would let me know whether it is in fact the case that one of the cruisers is to be named "H.M.S. Kenya", and if so, when she is likely to be launched and completed. In replying to the Governor it would, I imagine, be as well to warn him that the presentation of a piece of plate to one of his Majesty's ships is usually covered by a dedication agreement, and perhaps
