As regards Lt. Swaine, as the A.C. say
that his emoluments are in excess of £400
per month can be no further question &
hence anything but the £40.

As regards the N.C.O., please minutes
of 20 Feb 1917 p. 8958/26. Although the W.O.
say that "they had assumed" that the
rates ~~per~~ mentioned in 20688/25 would
be paid, irrespective of the pay &
allowances of the men concerned, this
does not strengthen their argument
from our point of view. They mention the
cost of training & pensions as examples of
other liabilities : assuming that Sgt. Jagannath
pays £100 per mth, & allowing £3. p.m.
(roughly 15%) as the cost of pension, this
leaves £8. p.m. to be covered by such
liabilities as "cost of training" etc.
It would have been more convenient
if the A.C. had attempted a statement
of other liabilities & their approximate

amounts.

The A.C. would, I fancy, be hard put to it to make out that their N.C.O. cost them £30 a month; but I doubt very much whether it is ~~desirable to~~ ^{desirable to} pressure them to furnish proof. But obviously if these individuals are only going to get their Army rates, there should be no question of the contribution from the Paymaster to Army funds in respect of their employment being increased after a "probationary" period.

I (A.C. 8) say that it is noted that in Army endowments of Lt Swaine are amounts of £20 per mensem the H.C. will be asked to arrange for a contribution at the rate of £40 per mensem to Army funds through C.A. in respect of that Officer.

With regard to Sgt. Farguhar, say ^{although it does not appear} that while there seems to be some doubt whether the actual ~~cost~~ charges ^(fallen) upon Army funds in respect of this N.C.O., including the cost of training etc. of pension, will amount to so much as £30 per mensem, he does not wish to press the matter further provided that the H.C. ^{raises no objection} & that Officer will be requested to arrange for a contribution at the rate of £30 per

less the amount of the local disbursements to Sgl. P., to be paid through C.A. in this case.

But observe that, as it appears that this Officer & N.C.O. will continue to receive pay & all as at their Army rates, irrespective of the rates of contribution payable to Army funds by the K.O.R., the question of considering an increase in those rates after a period of probation, as was ^{all other} mentioned in para 2.7 the letter of 15 Sept. (A.F.S.S. 8/26) from their Dep't, would ^{not appear to} arise.

Considering that the idea of sending these Royal Engineers to E.Africa is to give them experience in railway construction without any extra expense falling on Imperial funds, it seems remarkable that the War Office should expect to make a profit on the transaction, but in view of correspondence which has passed, it is doubtful whether we are in a position to withstand their claim.

Originally (54241/25) the W.O. accepted the General Manager's terms with regard to salary without any qualification, but later (No.1 on X.F.5958) at the instigation of the Treasury they asked for the assurance referred to in this letter. The H.Cr. for Transport, on being consulted as to this, himself mentioned the possibility of increases after a probationary period - no doubt under the impression, as we are ourselves were, that the rates he had offered would go to the men employed, who would benefit by any such increase. The assurance given to the W.O. in para. 2 of our letter of the 15th September was "that the amounts to be paid to Army funds by the railway administration are adequate on the basis of the cost to the railway of engaging civilian employees of comparable grades elsewhere". The S. of S. in giving this assurance mentioned the remarks of the H.Cr. about later increases, but said that no prospect of an increase should be held out to the individuals concerned.

The present rates (£40 p.m. in the case of an officer and £30 p.m. in the case of the Warrant Officer) are the minima of the scales for corresponding civil appointments. The railway would, of course, have to

offer increments to civilian employees and, in the circumstances, I think it will have to be agreed that if the H.Cr. thinks the men ~~want~~ merit an increase after a probationary period, the pledge given will require that such increase should be paid to Army funds. Rates ration allowance proposed is appreciably higher than rates which obtain in other parts of the world, and would be glad to learn how date is arrived at, etc.

In their letter of the 22nd March (No. 4) the War Office said that ration allowance to C.S.M. Farquhar should be paid at a rate to be assessed by the Crown Agents, the rate being noted to them in due course. In communicating this to the High Commissioner we said that it was understood that the Army Council would be glad if he would fix an appropriate rate. In view of this it is probable, as we hinted to the War Office in our letter of the 26th April, that the Acting High Commissioner has already begun to issue the allowance at the rate of 6/- a day. But the War Office do not ask that we should do more than ask for information as to the basis of the assessment, and I think it will be sufficient if we send a copy of this letter to the High Commissioner asking for the information desired by the War Office. I submit draft herewith.

2. On these figures it is suggested that 3/- per
day would be a fair estimate of cost of rations in Nairobi.
Company Sergeant Major Farquhar is however stationed in an
outlying district of Uganda where the cost of the
commodities mentioned may reasonably be taken to be 50%
above Nairobi prices. Moreover he is unable to obtain his
meals from a mess and has to employ a native cook whose
wages are approximately Shs.1/50 per day. The cost of
rations amounts therefore to about Shs.6/- per day.

With reference to your letter No. 10159/27 dated 25th April 1927, and in continuation of War Office letter No. 074/8198 (F.O.) dated 22nd March 1927, on the subject of ration allowance for Company Sergeant-Major Farquhar, Royal Engineers, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that the rate of 6/- a day proposed for ration allowance is appreciably higher than the rates which obtain in other parts of the world, the rate on the West Coast of Africa being, for example, only 2/2d a day. They would accordingly be grateful if they could be informed of the items on which the suggested rate is based and of the arrangements which Company Sergeant-Major Farquhar has to make for his messing.

I am to explain that ration allowance in the Army is designed to cover the actual cost of the uncooked articles of food necessary to maintain the soldier in health and excludes luxuries of alcoholic drinks, the extra cost of which, at stations abroad, is allowed for in colonial allowance. If, however, Company Sergeant-Major Farquhar necessarily obtains his meals from a civilian mess, there is no objection to the inclusion of an element for cooking and service. The list of foodstuffs, together with their retail cost on which ration allowance at home is based is enclosed for the information of the Acting High Commissioner for Transport in Kenya and Uganda.

With reference to the last paragraph of your letter, 10159/27, dated 24th February, 1927, and previous correspondence regarding the contributions payable to Army Funds in respect of the employment of Lieutenant Swaine and Sergeant Farquhar, Royal Engineers, with the Kenya and Uganda Railway, I am commanded by the Army Council to request you to submit, for Mr. Amery's consideration, that the loan of military personnel for employment on the Kenya and Uganda Railway was sanctioned, subject to the assurance given in paragraph 2 of your letter of 15th September, that the amounts paid to Army Funds by the Railway Administration would be equivalent to the rates paid for civilian employees of comparable grades. In your letter of 15th July, it was stated that the minimum rates for the appointments in question were £40 a month for Civil engineers and £30 a month for Inspectors of Works, and that if these rates were paid in the first instance an increase would be considered after a probationary period of six months, if the capacity of the individuals merited such consideration.

The fact that it has been arranged that the amount of the Civil salaries of the appointments shall be paid to Army Funds while the personnel in question draw their military emoluments appears to the Council to be immaterial, and they suggest that if the qualifications of the officer and Non-Commissioned Officer after the completion of the probationary period would have merited an increase in salary had they been employed as civilians, it would be necessary, if the assurance given by your Department is to hold good, that Army Funds should be given the benefit of such increase. They would be glad if Mr. Amery would consider the matter from this point of view.



With reference to the letter from your Department, No.X.F.5958/26, dated 19th January, 1927, regarding the employment of Lieutenant Swaine and Sergeant Farquhar, Royal Engineers, with the Kenya and Uganda Railway, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that having regard to the conditions of employment forwarded with your Department's letter No.38319/1927 dated 25th September, 1925, they had assumed that the Railway would pay the civil rates proposed for credit to Army funds, irrespective of the amount of the pay and allowances drawn by the military personnel concerned. Moreover, it will be realised that these current emoluments do not cover the whole of the liabilities of Army funds in respect of their military service: the cost of training, etc. and of pensions are examples of liabilities not so covered.

The Council would be glad, therefore, if you would arrange for the Railway to pay the sum of £30 a month (in the first instance, subject to increase, if so decided, after the probationary period, as fore-shadowed in the second paragraph of your letter X.F.5958/26 of 15th September, 1926) in respect of Sergeant Farquhar to the Crown Agents for the Colonies for remittance by them to this Department, less any payments made locally in respect of Sergeant Farquhar's Army pay and allowances.
