2. In your des. it is stated that the Forest boundary of 1912 was shown in the map of the ~~Kambua~~ *Kambua* Native Reserve which accompanies your des. No 970 of the 9th

Nov 1926. A comparison of (with the map enclosed in) that map with the des. under ref. shows that the boundary in the latter

map does correspond with the
boundary indicated by a continuous
green line in the corrected
map in which it is stated
that the forest boundary as
Gatzke (1912) is represented
by the broken green line.

I have the honour to refer to my despatch No.970 of the 9th November, 1926, and to the maps which were transmitted to you in connection therewith illustrating the Native Reserve Boundaries as published in the Official Gazette dated the 13th October, 1926.

2. The Acting Director of Land Surveys now reports that the Boundary of the Kikuyu Escarpment Forest Reserve (L.O.No.4448) was wrongly shown on the maps submitted to you, the Forest boundary of 1912 being shown instead of that which at present subsists.

3. I enclose two copies of a map which shows the corrected boundary. No alteration of the description of the Reserve which appeared in the Official Gazette is necessary.

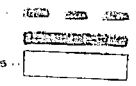

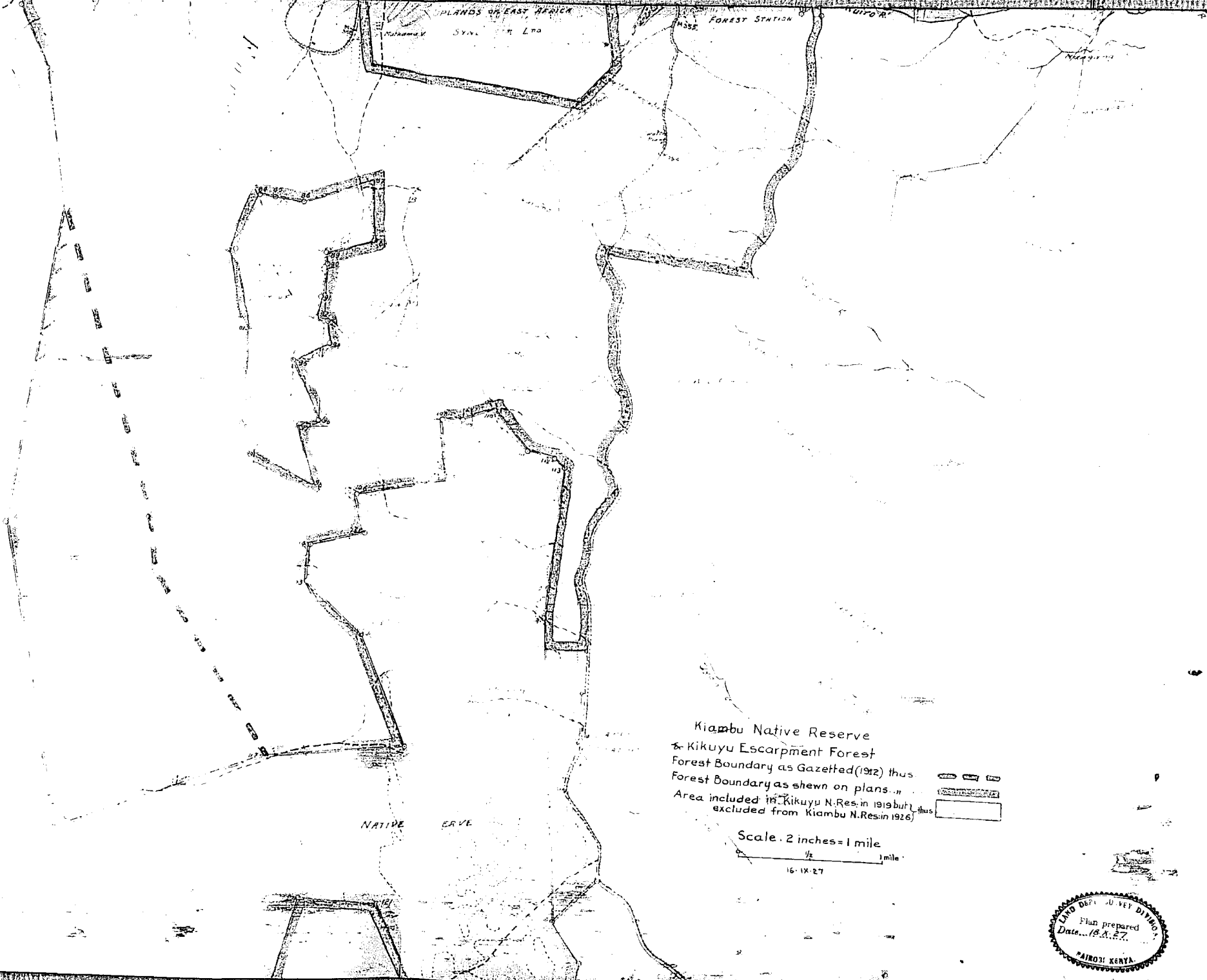

DEMARICATION OF NATIVE RESERVE
BOUNDARIES

In order to reduce as far as possible the cost and labour involved in the demarcation of Native Reserve boundaries returns are required in which the gazetted boundaries of each Reserve will be classified as follows:

- a. Not requiring further survey, by reason of
 - (i) the boundary consisting of natural features, e.g., a river, or
 - (ii) adequate survey and demarcation, or
 - (iii) desert nature of the locality, or
 - (iv) any other reason
- b. Requiring further survey, to be carried out by
 - (i) qualified surveyors, or
 - (ii) District Officers, e.g., in cases where two districts of homogeneous population march or where owing to the paucity of population indication of the existing physical features suffice.

Senior Commissioners should compile the returns for the various Districts of their Provinces into a Provincial Return. Where two Provinces march the Senior Commissioners should agree as to the classification before making the return. Where a Native Reserve marches with the boundary of a Non-Native District the Senior Commissioner should agree with the Resident Commissioner in charge of the latter district before making the return.

For the purpose of clarity the following imaginary example is given of the return as required

Description	Classification	Remarks
Commencing at the intersection of the Forest Reserve with X River the boundary follows that river to its junction with the Y River.—	a (i)	
thence by the westerly boundaries of Farms L. O. Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, to the S. W. corner of Farm 1, 4.	b (ii)	Important.
thence by the southerly boundary of 1, 4 to the Forest Reserve.	b (i)	Important.
thence by the Forest Reserve boundary to the S. E. corner of Farm 1, 5.	a (i)	
thence by the easterly boundary of Farm 1, 5 and the easterly boundaries of Farms 1, 6, 7, to 21 to the N. E. corner of Farm 1, 21.	a (ii)	Farm boundaries already demarcated by stone cairns or trenches.

In the case of boundaries requiring further survey the importance of the survey should be noted in the 'Remarks' column.

The Return should be forwarded to the Director of Land Surveys as early as possible.
