





DEMARCATION OF NATIVE RESERVE BOUNDARIES

In order to reduce as far as possible the cost and Tabour involved in the demarcation of Native Reserve boundaries returns are required in which the gazetted boundaries of each Reserve will be classified as follows:

a Not requiring further survey, by reason of

- i the boundary consisting of natural
- features, e.g., a river, or
- ti adequate survey and demarcation, or
- 111 desert nature of the locality, or
- iv any other reason

b Requiring further survey, to be carried out by

i, qualified surveyors, or

(ii) District Officers, e. g., in cases where two districts of homogeneous population march or where owing to the paucity of population indication of the existing physical features suffice.

Senior Commissioners should compile the returns for the various. Districts of their Provinces into a Provincial Return. Where two Provinces march the Senior Commissioners should agree as to the classification before making the return. Where a Native Reserve marches with the boundary of a Non-Native Postrict the Senior Commissioner should agree with the Resident Commissioner in charge of the latter district before making the return.

For the purpose of clarity the following imaginary example, is given of the return as required

In the case of boundaries requiring further survey, the importance of the survey should be noted in the 'Remarks' column
