Mr. Foster & I saw Lady Andros yesterday about this. It appears that the O.N.A. are in some difficulty, as Lady Gugg is endeavouring to obtain nurses through them & other bodies, but they cannot get any clear idea either as to the qualifications required or as to the salaries and conditions of service. Naturally they do not want to send out any nurses except under a clear and definite agreement which they are satisfied that the employers have the means and the power to honour.

I have drafted for comment after discussing with Mr. Postonley. The draft also covers the points mentioned in X 17168/27 regards, in which a copy should be filed.

the presence of official representatives
 in the Local Committee and
 by the fact that the Govt.
 has added to the
 establishment of the Medical
 Dept a lady Medical
 officer for this work. I
 am authorised further to say that it
 is clear that, in the
 event of the organisation
 ultimately
 essentially breaking down
 for lack of funds or for
 any other reason, it
 would devolve upon the
 Colonial Govt. whether to
 carry on the work or to
 wind it up with due
 regard to existing
 commitments. Any necessary
 also

who might go out under the scheme could therefore feel assured that there was no need for apprehension as to the security of their contracts. I hope that this statement will go some way to meet your difficulties.

The only other suggestion I can make is that Lady Grigg should be invited, before she returns to Kenya, to indicate some person or persons over here with whom you could deal as representing the local organisation, and who would be empowered to enter into contracts on behalf of the local Committee.
