am inclined to think this should
be specially provided in B.O. &
we should receive Govt's sanction in
that connection.

I have the honour to refer to your despatch No.1182 of 21st November, 1924, on the subject of extra remuneration paid to officers who undertake employment outside the scope of their ordinary duties, and to inform you that it has been found necessary at present to employ an African Police School teacher on additional duties as Storekeeper for the District Commissioner's Stores there.

2. His substantive emoluments as a teacher are Shs.30/- per mensem met from the Education Department's vote and in recognition of your approval, sanctioned the payment to him of an additional Shs.20/- per mensem for his additional duties so long as he is called upon to perform the Storekeeper's duties which he is able to do while not engaged upon his educational duties.

I am satisfied that this arrangement is the most economical one from Government's point of view, and I shall be glad to receive your covering sanction of my action.

3. I am aware that an officer's whole time is at the disposal of Government but cases arise from time to time in which an officer is called upon to perform duties that are entirely different from and outside the scope of his substantive ones and which warrant the payment of
