NOW, THEREFORE, We do hereby revoke Our said Commission dated the Fifth day of November, 1928, and Our said Commission dated the tenth day of April, 1929, and do declare that henceforth and until Our pleasure shall be further signified, the administration of the Government of OUR Colony of Kenya shall be regulated by the provisions of the Letters Patent in force in Our said Colony.
