Mr. Allen,

Yes. All tels. except "personal" messages are included in the series and the Gov. shd. follow the same line.

I shd. not have thought that the Kenyaradio Service at 9d a word en clair was "considerably" cheaper than the cable rate for coded messages at 1/2 (Govt. rate) or even 2/4 (public rate) when our Code is held to save approx. two thirds of the number of words and in addition provides for the words of more than 10 letters (the maximum by cable or wireless for any word).

Normally we do not use Kenyaradio because of its unreliability but doubtless it will be considered that the Govt. may be left to please himself. Only 5 such messages have been recd. in 1930.

I have the honour to refer to Mr. Amery's despatch No. 4 of the 2nd January, (No. 9, on 15232) (Ref. 15232) regarding the procedure to be adopted in 1929, respecting the telegrams sent by Government on behalf of private individuals and to inform Your Lordship that in the case of telegrams which are not of a confidential nature but merely deal with ordinary routine matters of leave, applications for transfer, etc., it has been customary to send 'en clair' via Kenyaradio Wireless Service as the cost by this route is considerably cheaper.

2. It is assumed that in the case of telegrams sent in code the cost recoverable from the individual concerned should be based on the number of code words used and not on the actual words contained in the message.

3. I should be glad to learn whether this method of dealing with such telegrams meets with Your Lordship's approval and if these telegrams should be included in the series of numbered telegrams.
