Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt  
of your letter No. 19233/25 of the 18th May regarding the  
date of completion of the Contract for the construction  
of the Kilindini Harbour Works.

2. We informed the Contractors that the Secretary  
of State had been advised by the Governor of Kenya that  
progress in connection with their contract was inconveniently  
slow and that the Secretary of State hoped that every  
effort would be made to expedite the completion of the  
works.

3. We now enclose a copy of a letter dated 22nd  
May which we have received from the Contractors. A copy  
of this letter was forwarded to the Consulting Engineers  
for their observations, and we now enclose a copy of a  
letter dated 2nd June which we have received from them. We  
also enclose a copy of the letter dated 21st May from  
the Consulting Engineers to whom reference is made in  
their letter of the 2nd June. It will be seen from the  
accompanying letters that due to the substitution of  
double storey sheds for single storey sheds on the one  
face, the Consulting Engineers have agreed to an extension  
of nine months to the Contract period for completion.

The Contract date for the completion of the work is now February 7th, 1926 but the Consulting Engineers point out that the work will not be finished by that date and that for any delay beyond that date the Contractors should, in their opinion, be held responsible.

It will further be observed from the Consulting Engineers' letter of the 2nd June that the Contractors are claiming compensation in respect of the difficulties resulting from the substitution of double storey sheds on the main farmingleyside and the greater maintenance risk which they believe has been incurred. It has, however, been agreed that the question of compensation should remain pending stand over until the work is passing completion.

The Consulting Engineers in the last paragraph of their letter of the 2nd June express the opinion that contractors are genuinely anxious to complete the work as soon as possible.

A LETTER FROM MESSRS PAULING & CO., LTD., TO THE CROWN AGENTS.

My dear Sirs:

We are in receipt of your letter F.M. 20/5 dated 20th May 1925.

We consider that the Governor of Kenya has been wrongly advised as regards the progress of the works in connection with our contract for deep-water wharves at Kilindini.

The transit sheds, now being built, are of a most elaborate and intricate nature and are entirely different from those we originally contracted to build.

Although labour in this country is infinitely superior to that which is obtainable in Abyssinia, similar steps have taken such longer to erect in England than the advisers of the Governor seem to think necessary at Kilindini.

It will be much obliged if you will assure the Governor of the fact that we are working, and will continue to make every effort to get the work completed at the earliest possible moment.

REPLY TO YOUR LETTER.

- We have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated May 25th, 1925, and enclose:
1. The Contractor has informed us that the date originally given to Shewanon Indians materials now being built, is anticipated to take two months longer than the original contract period to build. The original contracts were for one and a half story houses, the present ones now under construction are double storey, so they are somewhat larger. If transit difficulties are taken into consideration.
  2. On the other hand the double storey buildings, as being built, are not in proportion, substantially different from the double storey wagashans which the Contractors also contracted to build, though some modifications in details of the house design had to be made to accommodate the varying site travelling charges which are to be installed remain.
  3. The Contractors are, in our opinion, unduly anxious to an extension of time on account of having to erect double instead of single storey houses on the quiet. There exists no authority or legislation on this account by the natives and advised a separate letter to you on the subject on 27th May 1925.
  4. The estimated date for completion of the contract is now February 1st, 1926. It is certain, however, that the work will not be finished by that date, for the delay in completion beyond that date the Contractors should properly, in our opinion, be held responsible.

6. With regard to the Contractors' statement that

driving piles have taken much longer to erect in England than the opinion of the Governor used to think necessary at Kiltindini, this may be so.

On the other hand, it is also true that in erecting that in the port of London two piles of very similar design, but respectively 1,100 and 1,150 feet long against 400 feet at Kiltindini, were erected eight days and twenty-one months; all the foundation piles for both ships having previously been driven in 9 months.

6. At Kiltindini, where the construction of the superstructure is proceeding pari passu with the driving of the foundation piles, it is only necessary to have a limit of 180' apart for the piles to enable the superstructure work to be proceeded with continuously. A compensation with the progress of the above mentioned similar work is therefore easily made.

7. In view of the Contractors arrangements

to have the work done as soon as possible, and my own opinion, having steps to this end, I would suggest that always in those which we can do so, the contractors should be given a period of 180 days.

5. It has been agreed that the question of compensation shall, without prejudice, stand over until the work is nearing completion, if the Contractors desire the question of an extension of time to be settled now.

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6. This particular claim for an extension is contained in our letter of 24th April 1924, in which they say:-

"The question of extension of time is not really well decided now, as up to date, we have had the same position as we were under the contract when we allowed one year for driving the simplex piles and setting the "drawings, and two years for building the warehouse." No specific allowance of time for the shed work was neither included nor arranged with the contractors, but as the Contractors now desire it is open to them to make the above statement."

Our view on the question of the extension of time that would be granted is that if a sum of the time required to build the second double storey shed by the Contractors are given a reasonable extension of time for the second shed, they should have sufficient time first to get the site ready for the first sheds, and, as construction actually commenced, does not give the site for the second shed ready.

7. Work on the sheds on the quay front, whether single or double storey, cannot be started till the filling at the back of the quay, progress on which depends on the progress on the quay wall, sufficiently far advanced to allow of the foundation piles being driven; so the date for the completion of the sheds, must be considered in relation to the present extended date for completion, 1st May 7th 1925, which date was fixed after taking into account difficulties, and consequent delay, met with when building the quay wall.

8. We consider that the extension of time that should be allowed is the difference between the time required to construct single storey shed on simplex piles, as originally intended, and a double storey shed on ferro-concrete piles, as now arranged for.

10. We are of opinion that a single storey shed on simplex piles  
did not have been built at Kilindini under six months, and that there  
would be no difficulty in building at Kilindini a double storey shed  
on reinforced concrete piles in 15 months.

11. We have therefore granted the Contractors an extension of  
months on this account and enclose a copy of our letter to them  
on the subject.

12. This makes the extended date for completion February 1st.

13. This does not imply that the work will actually be finished  
that date, as this does not take into account delays for which the  
Contractors should be held responsible.

14. In our letter to you of 23rd April, 1925, we informed you  
the Contractors anticipate completing the work by August 1st.

15. Though every endeavour will continue to be made to  
complete the work, we fear it is unlikely that the Contractors  
will complete the work much earlier than the date they have given.
