Formation of corps of coloured troops for service in Jubaland



BRITISH EMBASSY BO ME

Your Excellency.

Italian Treeps in Jubaland.

I have the honour to submit herewith, for Your Excellency's information, a copy of a report which has reached me from a reliable source: -

Portthe maintenance of order and safety in Transjubs it has been found necessary to form a special corps of o coupation composed of coloured troops (Arab, Eritrean and Somalis). These troops are commanded by Italian Army officers.

Enlistment, begun in December 1924, was viewed favourably by the natives, and has made possible the formation of units which, after intensive training, show that they possess the necessary tactical skill.

On March 21st, 1925, in the some of Omargergeb near Mogadiscio, tactical exercices, with service ammunitien, were carried out by native infantry units, machine-gun sections, and camel-pack artillery sections. His Royal Highness the Duke of the Abrussi, who witnessed the exer-cise received the troops in review and expressed his satief stien at the rapid and excellent training of the new units.

A semi-official communiqué states that the strength of this special corps is about 2000 men. It adds that this force is net sufficient to give Italy the necessary control over the unruly tribes; an increase in the numerical strength of the force may therefore be expected in due course.
