Note Verbale to Italian Government, 21st May, 1925. Cession of Jubaland.

NOTE VERBALE

With reference to their Note Verbal No. 102 His Britannic Majesty's Embassy have the honour to inform the Royal Italian Ministry for Foreign Affairs that His Majesty's Government are prepared to agree to the forthcoming cessation of Jubaland taking place on June 1st subject to the following conditions:-

1. The Italian Government undertake to furnish all assistance to ^{the} Kenya Government in evacuating stores etc., from ceded territory after the ^{war} safer, arranging camel and other transport to Kisumu, neighbouring British ports at the usual rates of hire and in particular providing camels at the usual rates at Serenli to transport to Mandera one year's rations for the King's African Rifles garrison at that post, which are now lying at Kisumu.
2. Immoveable property of the local Government to pass to the Italian Government on the date of the transfer on terms to be arranged later.
3. Moveable Government property, including river transport, to remain British until withdrawal of the garrison has been completed. After the withdrawal the Government of Kenya will be prepared to consider the sale of moveable property, including river craft, barges etc., to the Italian Government on terms to be arranged by ^a Joint Commission provided under Article 10. If the Commission is unable to agree they will refer the matter to their home Governments.

The Embassy have the honour to enquire whether the Royal Italian Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be so good as to inform them as soon as possible if the Royal Government agree to the above-mentioned conditions in order that the necessary instructions may be sent to Kenya.
