Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Chamberlain to transmit to you herewith, to be laid before the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the accompanying copy of a telegram from His Majesty's Minister at Addis Ababa reporting that his Italian colleague has advised his government to address an ultimatum to the Abyssinian Government.

2. Mr. Chamberlain will be glad to learn whether circumstances similar to those described by Count Colli have ever arisen on the Abyssinia-Kenya frontier and if so whether the Kenya Government have ever sent troops across the frontier or occupied an Abyssinian post with a view to securing redress for crimes committed by Abyssinians.

Italian Minister tells me that he is telegraphing to suggest that Italian government send ultimatum to Abyssinian government.

Eight months ago Abyssinians raided cattle across frontier of Erythrea. When two Italian subjects crossed into Abyssinia to identify their cattle both were murdered. Italian Minister demanded arrest of murderer but in spite of repeated promises from Ras Taffari arrest has never been effected. Whilst admitting probable inability of Ras Taffari to keep promise Italian Minister considers that Abyssinian government requires a sharp lesson. He suggests that Italian troops cross frontier to arrest murderer if Abyssinian government cannot do so.
