funds of the Dependencies concerned three sums  
of £500 each in the name of the three  
officers mentioned.

2. I am also to request that you  
will take out, on behalf of the three Govts, life insurance policies ~~for £500~~ on the lives of  
proposed Governors. ~~Each of these three officers~~ ~~are already~~ ~~insured~~ ~~privately~~ ~~with~~ ~~the~~ ~~North~~ ~~British~~  
Mercantile Insurance Coy. Ltd through  
the Civil Service Insurance Society. The  
policies should be endorsed for assignment for £500 payable  
death or after 2 years.
