On the 1st instant the Lord Commissioners of the Treasury have had before them Mr. G. C. ...
2nd instant (40275/25) relative to the allowances to European Officers
and to the Hungarian Territories, and to propose to convey to the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following general scheme:

My Lords note that despatches have been received from the Officers Administering the Government in these three Dependencies proposing a revision of substantive salaries in which an additional allowance would be incorporated, but they have not yet been able to confer and to frame a joint scheme embodying the view of all three Governments.
