Sir, M'amba.

The contracts and high-level steel foundations for M'amba  
pier No. 2 are now complete. Contracts for the furniture work  
the same should have been placed six months ago. This was not  
done as I believed that the property had in principle and to all  
intent and purpose been accepted by Government and I advised  
Government had formulated its policy in respect of the works.

I have reason to believe that the Port is rapidly  
approaching another serious crisis, which these works and their  
completion would forestall. Six invaluable months have already been lost to  
the Colony, my Company having been paralysed and the Government having  
done nothing.

Will you therefore, before the last threads of my  
organisation vanish (namely June 1st), advise as whether Government  
will cover of the paralysis it has inflicted on my Company and  
taken other steps to meet the imminent crisis and, if not, what  
steps, if any, I can safely take to secure for the Colony the  
immediate pursuance of this vital work.
