Mr. Secretary.

The economic and high-level class foundations for Hitler's power are now well known to us. The financial and industrial leaders have been captured 100% morally and their men are now in Hitler's hands. The military has also capitulated and is all under Hitler's control. The last bastion left by Government and I consider it to be the Foreign Office. As far as I am aware, no report of the Foreign Office has been issued to Parliament since the War began. It is now known to us that the War is being conducted in the name of various officials which were won over to Hitlerism. Our invaluable assets have already been lost to Hitlerism, many having been paralyzed and the Government being unable to act.

Will you therefore, before the last threads of my representation remain (namely June 2nd), advise me whether Government have taken any cover of the paralyzing it has inflicted on my Country and taken other steps to meet the imminent crisis and, if not, what steps, if any, I can safely take to secure for the Colony the immediate pursuance of this vital work.
